

# Student Uniform Guidelines



The St John's Grammar School uniform is a symbol of the School. It creates a sense of identity and belonging for our students. All students are required to wear the correct, full uniform with pride and parents are expected to support these guidelines. St John's Grammar School maintains high standards of uniform and general appearance. Students are required to demonstrate neat presentation, cleanliness and good grooming, while complying with the specifics of the uniform.

## 1. Specific Uniform Details

**ELC – Year 2** (Uniform designed to facilitate play-based learning)

### Summer:

- Polo shirt
- Sports shorts
- Sports socks
- Bucket hat

### Winter:

- Polo shirt
- Rugby top
- Polar fleece or maroon zip-up jacket
- Track pants
- Sports socks
- Beanie

**Years 3 – 12: Formal Uniform**

### Girls' Summer:

- Summer dress or shorts with summer shirt (maroon stripe)
- Blazer
- Short maroon socks
- Hat – broad brim

### Girls Winter:

- Tunic dress, shorts or grey charcoal pants
- Winter shirt (crystal blue stripe)
- Blazer
- Maroon woollen cardigan
- 70 denier maroon tights or long maroon socks

### Boys' Summer:

- Charcoal shorts
- Short sleeve shirt (maroon stripe)
- Blazer
- Short maroon socks Hat – broad brim

### Boys' Winter:

- Charcoal single pleat trousers
- Long sleeve shirt (crystal blue stripe)
- Belt with School buckle
- Tie
- Blazer
- Maroon woollen jumper with zip
- Short maroon socks
- Rugby top
- Maroon zip-up jacket
- White, monogrammed sports socks

**Year 3 – 12: Sports Uniform**

- Striped polo shirt
- Maroon sports shorts or maroon track pants

## 2. Wearing of the Uniform

### Winter or summer uniform

Generally, the summer uniform is worn in Terms 1 and 4 and the winter uniform is worn in Terms 2 and 3. Students may choose to wear a uniform out of season, in response to the weather, however the uniform must be worn in full. Students in Year 3 – 6 (only) are allowed to wear shorts in Winter with the long sleeved shirt and tie.

The length of the girls' summer dress and winter tunic must sit just above the knee (or longer). Students with shorter dress length will be considered in breach of the guidelines.

### Blazer

The blazer is required as part of the formal uniform (from Year 3 onwards). In Terms 2 and 3, students must wear the blazer as the outer layer when outside the school, including travelling to and from school.

### Sports Uniform

The sports uniform may be worn for the full day, including to and from school, on days when students have a PE lesson, a sports match or sports practice.

The sports uniform is worn for PE lessons and sports practices. Some sports have specific uniforms and details of these uniforms will be provided before the start of a new season.

### Shoes

Black leather school shoes are required for Years 3 – 12. Students must ensure their shoes remain polished. Students are permitted to wear brown leather sandals in summer.

Sports shoes that are suitable for indoor and outdoor use are required. The priority is for these to support the foot correctly. They must have a non-marking sole. Shoes that are not acceptable include high ankle boots, skate or recreational shoes that do not provide arch support.

### School Bags

All students must have the maroon, monogrammed St John's bag. Monogrammed PE bags are also available.

### Scarf

A St John's School scarf is available and can be worn with the winter uniform.

### Art Smock

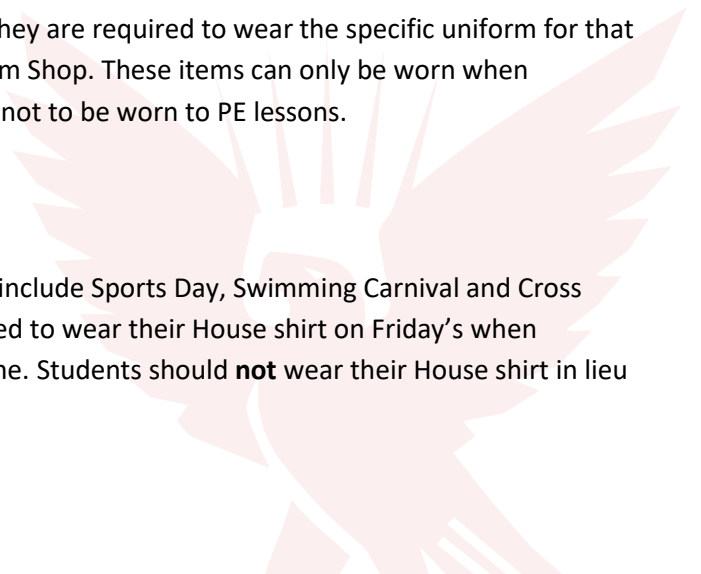
Students in Reception – Year 6 require an Art Smock, which is available from the Uniform Shop.

## 3. Sports Uniform

When students represent St John's Grammar in sports, they are required to wear the specific uniform for that sport. These uniforms can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. These items can only be worn when undertaking training or matches for that sport. They are not to be worn to PE lessons.

## 4. House Shirt

House shirts are worn at all House events. These events include Sports Day, Swimming Carnival and Cross Country. On the Secondary Campus, students are required to wear their House shirt on Friday's when participating in House activities, which occur at lunch time. Students should **not** wear their House shirt in lieu of their Sports shirt.



## 5. General Appearance

### Hair:

- Hair is to be kept neat, clean and appropriately styled for school.
- Unusual cuts, colours or styles are not allowed.
- Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be tied back.
- Hair ties should be maroon or light blue and school ribbons are available.
- Faces must be freshly shaved.

### Jewellery:

- Jewellery must be kept to a minimum.
- Students may wear a wristwatch.
- Students may wear a simple gold or silver neck chain, with or without a cross.
- Students may wear one small pair of earrings (either studs or sleepers) in their ear lobe. No other earrings are allowed.
- No finger rings or any other jewellery are allowed.

### Make-up:

- Students are not to wear visible make-up. Light facial concealer is permitted and lip moisturiser / protection may be worn.
- Coloured nail polish is not permitted.
- Tattoos must not be visible.

## 6. Compliance

Where students breach the school uniform guidelines, this will be managed through the Behaviour Policy. Consequences for breaching the school uniform guidelines may include, but are not limited to, detention and/or confiscation of offending items.

## 7. Purchase of Uniform

All items of School uniform are available from the Uniform Shop. The shop is open Monday's and Thursday's from 2 – 5:00pm and Tuesday's from 8 – 12:00pm. School holiday times are advised on the school website and appointments for fittings can be made through the school website.

## 8. Second Hand Uniform Shop

The St John's P&F run a Second Hand Uniform shop. Opening times and available stock are advertised on the Parents of St John's Facebook page.

## 9. Labelling

It is strongly recommended that all uniform items are clearly labelled.
